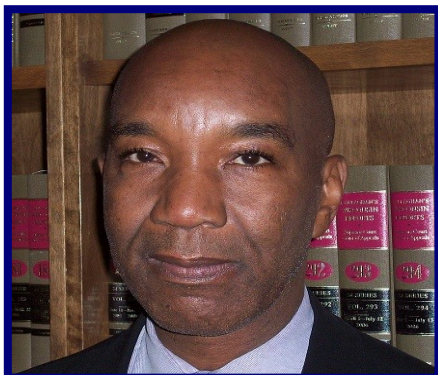

His experience includes co-lead counsel in the class action involving redlining discrimination against American Family Insurance Company, the class action settlement with the City of Milwaukee on behalf of African American Firefighters and the lawsuit challenging the Wisconsin voucher program.

James is past president of the NAACP Milwaukee Branch and is a founding member of 100 Black Men of Milwaukee. He is a former member of the Board of Directors of the ACLU of Wisconsin, and a past member of the ACLU National Board of Directors.
