

President's Letter

Dear Hampton University Students,

As we come to the end of academic-year 2021, I wanted to share with you some of the activities designed to improve your living and learning at this wonderful institution. Although, like the rest of the world, we are in the midst of a global COVID–19 pandemic, Hampton University's fundraising has gone extremely well. Fueled by the \$30 million donation from Ms. MacKenzie Scott, and other gifts from Dominion Energy, Ernst & Young, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Southern Company, Thermo-Fisher, Peloton, Mellon Foundation, NBC Universal, Truist Bank, Amazon Robotics, various federal agencies, our wonderful alumni, and other donors, the University has completed a number of campus enhancements. Each of these enhancements will benefit students, faculty, staff and the entire Hampton University community.

Enhancements have been completed in a number of areas. These include academic buildings such as Buckman, Turner, and DuPont Halls. Residence hall improvements can be found in Virginia Cleveland, DuBois, Moton, Winona, Continuing Education Center (CEC), and Stone. The main entrance gate, several athletic facilities and technology upgrades in the classrooms have also been improved as a result of the donations received by the University. Starbucks, a much anticipated addition to the campus, is also on the horizon. The above-mentioned campus enhancements are detailed on the following pages.

In addition to the campus enhancements, I am pleased to share that Hampton University has several new scholarship opportunities for new and continuing students. A focus on excellence in academics and character are essential tools to the success of Hampton students. The Character scholarship program has been created to recognize excellence in character. The University will award 100 first-time freshmen a \$10,000 renewable scholarship beginning with the 2021–2022 academic year. Additionally, continuing students, not previously awarded University merit scholarships may compete for annual scholarships in the amount of \$5,000. This scholarship will recognize continuing students with a cumulative 3.5 or higher grade point average. A total of \$2 million dollars has been designated for these two new awards.

We look forward to safely welcoming faculty and students back to campus to enjoy all of the hard work that has been done in preparing for your return.

The University repaired the porch columns and the roof of the building.


Upgrades were also made to classrooms and painting in the conference room for the Department of Physical Therapy. The auditorium was also upgraded with seating and stage curtains.

COVID-19 Upgrades

Hampton University is reducing the spread of COVID-19 through several practices, including cleaning and disinfecting. Daily deep cleaning protocols have been established, and campus-wide sanitation efforts have been enhanced. Housekeeping is performing routine cleaning of all buildings and facilities, twice a day cleaning of high touch surfaces, cleaning and disinfecting of all public/common bathroom facilities and after-hours electrostatic cleaning. Hampton University has added hand sanitizing stations and disinfecting wipes across campus. These will also be located in all academic classrooms, residence halls, the dining hall, as well as near time clocks and in all other building entrances and high traffic areas.

















Hattie McGrew Towers & Conference Center

The University is installing a new HVAC system throughout the residence hall. Upgrades will also be made to the mechanical room, electrical system, and plumbing piping system.



Virginia Cleveland Hall

The bathrooms were completely remodeled with granite counter tops. Repairs were made to the floors and windows. Wind screens were replaced.









W.E.B. DuBois Hall

The HVAC was upgraded in the residence hall. All floor bathrooms were completely remodeled with granite counter tops and new showers were installed. Upgrades were also made to the laundry room.











Moton Hall

The renovations to Moton Hall included installation of new windows as well as roof replacement.









Continuing Education Center (CEC)

The renovations to the Continuing Education Center (CEC) included making upgrades to the residence hall rooms, floor replacement, bathroom renovations, fan coil units and new fixtures.





Stone Manor Hall

The renovations to Stone Manor Hall included the bathrooms being completely remodeled with granite counter tops and new showers were installed, as well as structural repairs throughout the building.





Winona Hall

The renovations to Winona Hall included painting the exterior of the building. The lobby of the residence hall has been upgraded.

Renovations on the bathrooms are currently underway.

Solar panel system is being installed on the rooftop.
